Questions for Discussion/Reflection:

3. How would you describe or explain what it means to “make disciples”? In the sermon Trent talked about defining the call to make disciples as making more and better citizens of God’s Kingdom. How does this description compare and contrast to yours?
4. What aspect of Christian beliefs would you like to understand more fully (deep truth)? In what aspect of character would you like to grow (deep lives)? What actions would you like to take with greater regularity that honor God (deep love)? What has been your strategy for growing in these areas and what has hindered you in the past?
5. How have you sought the good of the West Shore (or the area in which you live) as a neighbor to others? As an employer/employee? As a student? As a member of your family?
6. How does believing that we are commanded by God to seek the good of our city in Christ change the way we approach our cultural surroundings? How might it change the perspective of those with whom we engage as it relates to the church and ourselves?
