Obedience Leads to a Life of Testimony for God's Glory

Main Point: Small steps of obedience lead to a life of testimony for God's glory

Why should we be obedient?

- Jesus was obedient. If we share in his suffering, we will share in his exaltation (v. 8)

How can we be obedient?

- Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling (v. 12)
- Do all things without grumbling or disputing (v. 14)
- Hold fast to the word of life (v. 16)

What are the effects of our obedience?

- We will be radiant gospel witnesses to non-Christians (v. 15)
- We will bring joy and encouragement to other Christians (v. 16-18)

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DISCUSSION & REFLECTION QUESTIONS

1. What stood out to you from the sermon and the Scriptures?
2. Why might it be comforting to know that God himself works obedience in us?
3. What are some areas of obedience where you tend to “grumble and complain?” How can you work towards more joy in those areas?
4. Why is it important that our obedience is a response to God and not a request?
5. What are some practical ways that you can “shine as a light” (v.15) in your workplace, school, home, or other area?
6. How have you been encouraged lately by another Christian’s obedience?
