Treating other Christians as second class is out of step with the gospel. (11-16)

Fear of man is out of step with the gospel. (12)

Hypocrisy is out of step with the gospel. (13-14)

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DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Read Galatians 2:11-16. What questions or observations immediately come to mind after reading this? Did anything from this Sunday's sermon particularly stand out to you?
2. Have you ever considered how important a tool ethnicity is in the redemptive plans of God from the beginning to the end of the Bible? What has been your experience related to conversations regarding ethnicity with other believers?
3. If you could snap your fingers and make anything happen in our church related to ethnicity as an opportunity for displaying the gospel, what would that be? Why?
4. How do you know when you're thinking about or treating another Christian as lesser than yourself?
5. Between fear of man and hypocrisy which are you most prone to? Why do you think this is, and how does it display itself?
6. Are there any ways that you feel your life is currently out of step with the gospel? If so, how and what can you do about it?
